Sign ordinance revision on Council agenda.

At our City Council meeting on Tuesday evening, September 18, we will be holding a hearing on amendments proposed to the sign ordinance by the Planning Commission. The Council meeting starts at 6 o'clock and the sign ordinance will be agenda item number 7.

Many of the signs currently in use in Laguna will become illegal under the proposed ordinance. These include all internally lighted signs, including neon and fiber optic signs, and many portable signs. All existing signs that do not conform to the new rules must be brought into conformance or removed.

In response to the changes proposed by the Planning Commission, the Laguna Beach Chamber of Commerce has proposed its own set of rules.

If you are an interested business owner or resident of Laguna Beach, you should come to the meeting to let us know your concerns.

It was inspiring seeing the large turnout (over 2000 people) at the candlelight vigil on Main Beach Friday night.

Laguna has again proven that it is a town with a huge heart. Bree Burgess Rosen and the No Square Theater group brought the sound equipment and provided the beautiful and inspirational singing.
